Nursing Grand Rounds

Monthly one hour scholarly presentations (4th Wednesday, 11:30 a.m. - 12:30 p.m.) provide current nursing research as well as topics related to clinical practice, education and patient/family values and preferences. (CNE credit)

Pediatric Challenges: New Approaches to Treatment and Prevention

Evening CME activities are offered several times a

year for primary care providers with a focus on new therapies and prevention strategies for common health problems in children and adolescents. Held in various metro area locations, these events begin with dinner followed by a 60 minute presentation and a panel Q and A session. (CME credit)

Perinatal Continuing Education Program (PCEP)

PCEP utilizes self-instruction materials developed by the University of Virginia and now published by the American Academy of Pediatrics. PCEP provides obstetrical, neonatal, transport, and follow-up information and skills. The program is offered to hospitals by contract and requires physician, nursing and administrative commitment for a nine-to-ten month period. Updates for previous PCEP participants are offered three years following the initial program. (AMA credit through the AAP and CNE credit)

Cardiac Care Symposium

12th Symposium on Pediatric Cardiac Diseases

March 1-4, 2009 • Vail, CO

This symposium focuses on pediatric cardiac abnormalities and emphasizes the team approach to diagnosing and managing pediatric cardiac disease. The program is designed to bring together the cardiologist, cardiac surgeon, anesthesiologist, cardiac nurse perfusionist and other health professionals who care for infants, children and adults with congenital heart disease. (CME and CNE credit)

Neonatal Resuscitation Program (NRP)

Instructor Course

March 4-5, 2009 • Aurora, CO

The NRP Instructor Course, appropriate for physicians, nurses, respiratory therapists and physician assistants, includes discussion of current scientific information, skills practice, performance evaluation and debriefing. Teaching strategies for NRP course implementation are emphasized. Successful completion of a NRP Provider Course is a prerequisite. AAP verification is awarded for successful course completion. (CME, AAFP and CNE credit)

Ethics Conference

March 20, 2009 • Aurora, CO

This conference addresses current ethical issues of interest in the healthcare of children. The conference is appropriate for nurses, physicians, therapists, social workers, chaplains, ethics committee members and persons involved in children's health concerns. (CME, AAFP and CNE credit)

Pediatric Infectious Diseases in Colorado: Update 2009

April 1, 2009 • Aurora, CO

Updates on pediatric infectious disease issues that have direct relevance to physicians, child health associates, physician assistants and nurse practitioners will be discussed. (CME and AAFP credit)

Colorado Chapter, AAP Annual Conference

Highlighting nationally known faculty with expertise in research and clinical care of women with HIV, this annual conference presents current topics of interest to providers who care for this population. (CME and CNE credit)

Reach the Peak – Asthma Educator Certified Prep Course

The Reach the Peak Asthma Educator Certification (AE-C) Prep Course is designed to equip healthcare professionals to successfully complete the National Asthma Educator Certification Board (NAECB) AE-C exam while improving asthma management in their practice. AE-C credentialing represents an evaluative process that demonstrates rigorous education and experience in asthma management and education. (CNE credit)

The Rosenberry Mental Health Conference

1st Teaching Course and Workshop on Acute Pediatric Cardiac Care

June 4-6, 2009 • Aurora, CO

This course offers the opportunity to integrate comprehensive theory with clinical experience related to acutely-ill pediatric cardiac patients. Importantly, through interactive workshops on hemodynamic scenarios (Baby Simulator), participants will demonstrate airway and arrhythmia management and troubleshoot pacemakers. The workshop on pediatric and neonatal ventilation and cardio-pulmonary interactions will be delivered by Dr. Peter Rimensberger from Geneva, Switzerland. (CME and CNE credit)

25th Annual Community & School Health Pediatric Conference

June 11-12, 2009 • Aurora, CO

Clinical updates will enhance knowledge for an integrated approach to healthcare of children in community settings. Neonatal Resuscitation Program NRP Renewal Courses

Course Dates below • Aurora, CO

The NRP Renewal Course must be taken by providers with a current NRP card prior to the expiration date on the card. The renewal course reviews the knowledge and skills required to resuscitate newborns. Participants must study the NRP Textbook in advance to pass the on-line written and in-class megacode evaluation. Cards for successful completion are provided by the American Academy of Pediatrics. (no CE credit)

Pediatric Advanced Life Support PALS Provider Courses

Course Dates below • Aurora, CO

Through lectures and skill stations, participants focus on a systematic approach to resuscitation of an infant or child. Evaluation is completed by clinical scenario management and written test. Basic Life Support is recommended and participants must review the PALS manual prior to the course. (CME credit)
